





Yesterday it was currently reported, that there were Letters in Town from France, which gave an Account that Admiral de Torres's Ship had taken fire by Accident in the Harbour of the Havannah, and was burnt to the Water's Edge; and that several of the Gallies, and other Ships in the Harbour were very much damag'd by the said Accident.  
We hear that Wednesday is appointed for the Departure of the Yachts to attend his Majesty's Return from his German Dominions.  
Yesterday the Right Hon. the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and other Governors of Christ-Hospital paid their Annual Visitation to the said Hospital, when the Boys spoke their Speeches in Latin and English, to the Satisfaction of all present.
